

## Classes, specimens and design for KMHS Flower Show, June 4<sup>th</sup>, 2024

- Class 1 Allium, 1 stem
- Class 2 Clematis, 1 bloom with foliage attached
- Class 3 Iris (bearded), 1 stalk
- Class 4 Iris, Siberian, same variety, 3 stalks
- Class 5 Lupin, 1 stem
- Class 6, Pansies (large-flowered type), same variety, same colour with foliage attached
- Class 7 Papaver (Oriental Poppy), 1 stem
- Class 8 Japanese Anemone, any colour, 1 stalk
- Class 9 Peony, single, any colour, 1 bloom
- Class 10 Peony, double red, 1 bloom
- Class 11 Peony, double white, 1 bloom
- Class 12 Peony, tree, 1 bloom
- Class 13 Peony, any other than above, 1 bloom

***Special Note:*** when preparing your Peonies for show, please remove all but the uppermost leaves as well as any side buds

- Class 14 Rose – Hybrid Tea/Grandiflora, any cultivar, 1 specimen bloom (must be disbudded)
- Class 15 Rose – Floribunda, any cultivar, 1 spray
- Class 16 Rose – Modern Shrub, any cultivar, 1 spray
- Class 17 Rose – English or Austin, any cultivar, 1 specimen bloom or spray
- Class 18 Rose – A Canadian rose (i.e. Explorer, Morden, Parkland), 1 specimen bloom or spray
- Class 19 Rose – miniature, 1 specimen bloom
- Class 20 Rose – miniature, 1 spray
- Class 21 Rose - floating in a bowl, 1 specimen bloom, no foliage
- Class 22 Violas (small flowered type), same variety, with foliage attached, 3 stems
- Class 24 Collection of Perennials (other than above) 5 kinds, 1 stem of each
- Class 25 Collection of Annuals, 5 kinds, 1 stem of each
- Class 26 Branch of a flowering shrub or tree, max. 30" above rim of container, 1 branch
- Class 27 Rhubarb, 3 stalks, heels left on, leaves trimmed to 2"

- Class 28      Other perennial vegetable, 3 of same kind, named
- Class 29      Annual vegetable, 3 of a kind
- Class 30      Annual fruit, 3 of a kind
- Class 31      Any other cultivar, other than above, 1 stem, bloom or spray
- Class 32      Hosta, same cultivar, 3 leaves

**POT ET FLEUR:** An exhibit of growing plants (in or out of pots) packed lightly with moisture-retaining material plus cut flowers in tubes of water, oasis or other material; all assembled in one container. Moss, decorative wood and rock may be included. No cut foliage is permitted. However, cut flowering and/or fruited branches may be used.
